Sailing Classes Offered

Basic Sailing Course

\$280

4 hours of virtual instruction over 2 sessions and 16 hours of supervised sailing on Budd Lake over a weekend.

Fun, affordable and local introduction to sailing! Learn to sail on a **boat with a single sail** with certified instructors from the Society for Education of American Sailors (SEAS). Successful students receive a SEAS Basic Sailing Certificate and current year membership in the club.

2024 Schedule – first 2 dates are 2-hour virtual sessions; last 2 are weekend sailing
June 4, 6 (via Zoom, 7-9 PM) June 8, 9 (at Budd Lake, 9 AM–5 PM)
July 9, 11 (via Zoom, 7-9 PM) July 13, 14 (at Budd Lake, 9 AM–5 PM)
August 27, 29 (via Zoom, 7-9 PM) ..Aug 31, Sept 1 (at Budd Lake, 9 AM–5 PM)

PREREQUISITES: No prior sailing experience necessary. Students under 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Students must weigh at least 85 lbs. and be able to tread water or float for 5 minutes without a PFD (lifejacket). Each student must bring their own PFD for water sessions.

Intermediate Sailing Course

\$280

5 hours of virtual instruction over 2 sessions and 16 hours of supervised sailing on Budd Lake over a weekend.

Enhance your sailing skills on a **boat with two sails** assisted by certified instructors from SEAS These sessions teach winds and the effect of 2 sails, knots, optimal sail positions of each sail, components of the boat, rigging the full sailboat, water safety procedures, rights on waterways and reading the weather. Successful students will receive a SEAS Intermediate Sailing Certificate and current year membership in SEAS Morris.

<u>2024 Schedule – first 2 dates are 2.5-hour virtual sessions; last 2 are weekend sailing</u>

May 14, 16 (via Zoom, 6:30-9 PM) May 18, 19 (at Budd Lake, 9 AM-5 PM) Sept. 17, 19 (via Zoom, 6:30-9 PM) Sept. 21, 22 (at Budd Lake, 9 AM-5 PM)

PREREQUISITES: Prior sailing experience is required. Minimum 18 years old. Students must weigh at least 85 lbs. and be able to tread water or float for 5 minutes without a PFD (lifejacket). Each student must bring their own PFD for water sessions.

Membership in either course allows you to return during "Open Sail" days, for the remainder of the current year, to enjoy sailing and practice while instructors are on-hand to facilitate skill improvement. SEAS Morris is a **not-for-profit 501c (3)** educational organization which is dedicated to teaching sailing at all levels with an emphasis on safety.

What's Next after BASIC and INTERMEDIATE?

BUDD LAKE OPEN SAILS



Throughout the sailing season, numerous opportunities are offered to club members to sign-up to go out on Budd Lake on the club's larger (14'-22') sailboats. As different skippers are available to take out a boat and crew, the club notifies the membership via email of the boat, date and time. Members then use SignUp GENIUS to join the trip as working crew.

This is a great opportunity to improve sailing skills on different boats under the supervision of certified skippers.

CRUISING FIRST MATE COURSE

Learn the necessary skills to manage and bring a larger boat back to port safely should something happen to the skipper. Join a SEAS trip as a first mate and learn from experienced SEAS skippers. Students must submit a sailing resume. Complete details available on the SEAS Morris website under *Learn to Sail*.



CRUISING SKIPPER COURSE

The skipper course provides you with the experience needed to plan and manage a bareboat charter with an able crew. Skipper candidates are expected to plan an itinerary, select anchorages, manage crew, and insurance management. Passing skippers will receive one (1) week of credit as skippering on their resume and a recommendation toward their skills. 


The SEAS Morris chapter has qualified skippers and a program to train and qualify members as first mates and skippers to participate in our charter sailing trips.
